6th Jan 1839: On the night of the big wind the thatched church in Carrigerry was blown down. Also seriously damaged that night were the homes of Thomas Powell of Latoon and Hugh Kenny of Ballygireen.

1810: Mr Barry's school in Killula reopened, claiming success for past pupils gaining entry to Maynooth and Trinity College. No tradition has survived about the exact location of this school. The proximity to Bishop O'Shaughnessy's residence in Mogullaan is interesting. He did a lot to support the education of the youth in the parish

1845: The large school house in Newmarket built by Lady O'Brien was licensed for the celebration of divine worship according to the rite of the Established Church.

25th Jan 1806: the post office was opened in Newmarket. The suffix 'on-Fergus' was added to avoid confusion with Newmarket in North West Cork,
